



Playing on the road can be fun but...



Kiran did her best to look after her brother and cousin and keep them safe, but sometimes Raju was too much to handle. His head was just stuffed with cricket.


“I’ll tell you what Ali,” Raju said to Ali, “while I bat you can field and catch my shots. You will have more fun that way.”


Ali waited. He wanted to show how good he was at cricket. Perhaps Raju would let him bat next time. He did not have to wait long.

"And what else," said Kiran.


"That I did not mind about Raju standing there too near the road."


"And what else" said Kiran.

And they went inside.






Before playing make sure the ground you are playing is not near the road or near traffic.


It is always best not to play near the road, especially if it is a busy one with heavy and fast traffic.

If you are playing near the road make your rules according to the traffic so the ball is not hit near the road or approaching traffic.

Also, if you are playing near a road make sure the younger children are in a safer place



If your ball runs across the road, never run after it. Pause, look and listen for approaching traffic. Then try to retrieve your ball. Never send a small child to retrieve the ball from the road

A nice clean road usually means that children are bound to play on or somewhere near it. Kiran and Raju too enjoy playing a game of cricket at the village ground. What they don't take into consideration is the on-going traffic that is so close to their playground. Things get worse when Raju positions his younger cousin Ali right next to the road for some fielding practice. Read more about what happens next.






